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DISOBEDIANCE OF THE RESTRAINT ORDERS / DIRECTIONS IN THE JUDGMENT DATED 29TH JULY, 2004 AND ORDERS DATED 14.1.1999 & DATED 22.3.2002 PASSED BY THIS HON'BLE COURT IN W.P.(C) No. 244 OF 1999 TITLED "RAKESH KUMAR & OTHERS V/s. D.D.A. & OTHERS".

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THE HON'BLE THE CHIEF JUSTICE OF HON'BLE DELHI HIGH COURT AND HIS HON'BLE COMPANION JUDGES

THE PETITIONER ABOVE-NAMED MOST RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH AS UNDER:-

1. That the petitioner alongwith two others filed a Civil Writ Petition [W.P.(C) No. 244 of 1999] titled "Rakesh Kumar & Others Versus D.D.A. & Others" in this Hon'ble Court. The respondents named in the said writ petition were (1). Delhi Development Authority; (2). Municipal Corporation of Delhi; (3). Government of NCT, Delhi; and (4). Deputy Commissioner of Police (East). The crux of the matter in the said writ petition was that the respondents therein harassed the petitioners by illegally attempting to dispossess the petitioners therein from their suit properties falling in Block No. 33, in the area of Village Karkardooma, in the abadi of Bhikam Singh Colony, Vishwas Nagar, Shahdara, Delhi-110032 and forcibly attempting to demolish the same. This was despite the admitted fact that the name of the said colony "Vishwas Nagar", though an unauthorized colony, finds mentioned in the list of 1071 unauthorized colonies to be regularized by the Govt. of NCT, Delhi and other civic bodies, as per the policy of the government having statutory force. Copies of the site plans, as annexed to the said writ petition are annexed hereto as Annexure: C-1 'Colly.'.



 That vide order dated 14.01.1999, Rule was issued and the respondents were restrained from demolishing the properties of the petitioners therein. The order dated 14.01.1999 reads as under:-

"14.01.1999 Present: Mr. A.S. Gambhir for the petitioners.

Mr. Ashish Kumar for the respondents.

Notice for the 14th of July, 1999.

Mr. Ashish Kumar, Advocate, accepts notice on behalf of the DDA. Counter shall be filed within three weeks.

There shall be an injunction restraining the respondents, their officers, representatives, agents, staff, etc. from demolishing the properties of the petitioners bearing Nos. 56, 57, 58, 60, 61, 62 & 30 in block No. 33, Gáli Nos. 8 & 9, Khasra Nos. 2135/201/1, 2151/210, 2149/210, 2884/203/3 in the area of village Karkardooma in the abadi of Bhikam Singh Colony, Vishwas Nagar, Shahdara, Delhi-32, until further orders.

That all the respondents were duly served. Vide order dated 22.3.2002, the interim order passed on 14th January, 1999 was made absolute. A true copy of the said order dated 22.3.2002 is annexed hereto as Annexure: C-3.

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4. That during the course of proceedings in the writ petition, the respondent No.1-DDA filed its counter affidavit on or about 16.7.2001. The other respondents did not file their counter affidavits till then. In the order dated 8.12.2003 passed by this Hon'ble Court in the said writ petition, it was observed, inter alia, thus:-

Rule was issued on 14.01.1999. However,, no affidavit has been filed by respondent 2 and 3. In the affidavit of DDA, it is stated that the land has been acquired but not placed at the disposal of the DDA. Thus the stand of respondents 2 and 3 becomes necessary.

That sometime in July, 2004, the respondent No. 2 therein, viz. M.C.D.
 filed its counter affidavit. Relevant paras 3 and 4 of the same are reproduced as under-

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 I state that the answering respondent-the Municipal Corporation of Delhi is neither a necessary nor proper party to the present petition and the name of the respondent No.4 is liable to be deleted/struck off."

A copy of the said counter affidavit dated July, 2004 filed on behalf of MCD in W.P.(C) No.244/99 is annexed hereto as Annexure: C-5.

- That no counter affidavit was filed by respondent No. 3 therein (Govt. of NCT, Delhi), as no copy thereof was served upon the petitioner.
- 7. That ultimately, vide judgment dated 29.7.2004, this Hon'ble Court was pleased to dispose off the said writ petition. A copy of the said judgment dated 29.7.2004 passed in W.P.(C) No. 244 of 1999 is annexed hereto and marked as Annexure: C-6.

Certain policy guidelines were framed by Union of India regarding proposed regularization of those unauthorized colonies in Delhi. Some of the said relevant guidelines concerning formation of Resident Cooperative Society and applying to the DDA, were extracted in the judgment dated 29.7.2004 itself for the petitioners to comply. Vide communication dated 15.9.2004, the petitioners therein duly informed the DDA and Govt. of NCT, Delhi about the due compliances on their (petitioners') part. A copy of the communication enclosing list of members of the society dated 15.9.2004 with proof of service are annexed

hereto as <u>Annexure</u>: <u>C-7</u>. The petitioner's society again sent a reminder letter dated 29.10.2004 to DDA requesting it to give them a draft Indemnity Bond so as to enable them to furnish the same in compliance of the Court's order dated 29.7.2004. A copy of the reminder letter dated 29.10.2004 by the petitioners' society to DDA alongwith proof of service is annexed hereto as <u>Annexure</u>: <u>C-8</u> Moreover, in terms of clause 2.1 (a) of the policy guidelines (as reproduced in para 5 of the judgment dated 29.7.2004), it was incumbent upon the local body/ DDA to first provide the base map of the unauthorized colony to the Resident Society. Till date, no such base map has been provided by the DDA/local body.

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It is submitted that the petitioner did not raise any further construction on the suit property than what was already in existence at the time of filing of the writ petition. Status quo was maintained by the petitioner throughout.

That in due course the Resident Welfare Association Bhikam Singh Colony
Vishwas Nagar, Shahdara was duly registered under the Society Registration Act,
1860. A copy of the Registration Certificate No. S/50423/2004 dated 26.9.2004 is
annexed hereto as Annexure: C-9.

The said Resident Welfare Association and individuals residents have even been assessed to Property Tax by MCD. Copies of the Property Tax Receipts issued by MCD in favour of the said Resident Welfare Association and also in favour of individuals are annexed hereto as Annexure: C-10 'Colly.'.

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- 9. That thereafter the said Resident Welfare Association also applied for regularization of the unauthorized colony in question alongwith the necessary documents, such as site plans etc., to the Govt. of NCT, Delhi. vide Acknowledgement Receipt dated 31.12.2004 issued by Govt. of NCT, Delhi. A copy of the said Acknowledgement Receipt dated 31.12.2004 issued by Govt. of NCT, Delhi and the site plans are annexed hereto as Annexure: C-11 'Colly.'.
- 10. That even in the record of the DDA and MCD, the specific name of the Bhikam Singh Colony, Block No.33, Vishwas Nagar, Shahdara finds mention in the List of Unauthorized colonies to be regularized at serial Nos. 145 & 146. A relevant extract of the said List of DDA/MCD is annexed as Annexure: C-12.
- 11. That, as late as March, 2007 even the Central Government (UOI) clearly stated in para 5 of its Counter Affidavit filed in W.P.(C) No. 2112 of 2002 titled :Wazirpur Bartan Nirmata Sangh V/s. UOI & Others" in this Hon'ble Court thus:
 - "5. That further it is also humbly submitted that any action to demolish or remove properties falling in such unauthorized colonies that may be eligible for regularization in terms of the policy decision taken by the Union Government, at this stage would result in irreparable loss and hardship to the residents of such colonies."

A copy of the said Counter Affidavit dated March, 2007 filed on behalf of UOI in W.P.(C) No. 2112 of 2002 titled :Wazirpur Bartan Nirmata Sangh V/s. UOI & Others" in this Hon'ble Court, is annexed hereto as Annexure: C-13.

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That despite afore-mentioned stands of the MCD, UOI, Govt. of NCT, Delhi 12. and various restraint orders/judgments passed by this Hon'ble Court, all of a sudden and without any prior notice on 16th July, 2007 at about 11:00 AM, large number of labourers numbering about 150 alongwith 3 Trucks (bearing Registration Nos. DL1GB 3353, DL1GB 3354, & DL1GB 2880), 1 JCB Machine/Bulldozer (bearing Registration No. DL1M 0108) and other demolition gools, under the direct control and supervision of Contemnor/ Respondent No.3-Mr. Kanwar Sain and some other officers/staff of Municipal Corporation of Delhi numbering about 5-6 coupled with large number of police force, came to the site in question and without any warning commenced full-scale demolition of the structures standing on the petitioner's suit property. Demolition action of some neighboring properties in the vicinity was also carried out. The structures standing on the suit property were completely razed to the ground and flattened and the property was leveled. All the belongings of the petitioners and his family/occupants were also damaged and/or buried under the rubble. Entire demolition action was finished in a matter of less than 2 hours. Said Contemnor/ Respondent No.3 and the said officers/staff of MCD were present at the site throughout the entire action of demolition and personally supervised the same.

Except the Contemnor/Respondent No.3, the said remaining officers/staff present at site on behalf of the MCD did not disclose their identity, but only declared that they have clear orders from the Contemnor/Respondent No.1-Commissioner, MCD and Contemnor/Respondent No.2-Deputy Commissioner, MCD (Shahdara South Zone) to carry out the demolition action. But no such alleged orders/directions were shown or produced by them despite demand. On

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the contrary, said Contemnor/Respondent No.3 and the officers/staff of the MCD present there were even shown the copies of the stay orders dated 14.1.1999, 22.3.2002 and the judgment dated 29.7.2004 passed by this Hon'ble Court in the W.P.(C) No. 244 of 1999. Even a copy of the counter affidavit filed by MCD was also shown to them wherein it was clearly stated that MCD has nothing to do with the suit property and the entire area was in the control of DDA. But to no avail. Despite specific query, they did not inform as how and when the area in question was transferred by DDA to MCD for any development. They clearly declared that since they have the orders of demolition from their higher ups, they will not look at any court or its orders and the action of demolition shall be fully carried out come what may. No amount of reasoning could deter the Contemnor/Respondent No.3, the officers/staff and the work force of the MCD from carrying out demolition. It was as if all hell broke loose and there was nobody who could listen to any logic or reasons. MCD was showing its might that it is above law and the courts. It was openly declared by said Contemnor/Respondent No.3 and the officers/staff of the MCD and the police that if anybody tried to interfere in their demolition action, he will not be spared and will be immediately arrested and put behind the bars.

That it is submitted that after carrying out the totally illegal, unauthorized, forceful and blatantly contemptuous demolition of the suit property, the Contemnor/Respondent No.3, other officers/staff of MCD, and their labourers/workforce left the site. Soon thereafter, the petitioner through his duly constituted attorney, his family members/other occupants re-occupied and re-possessed the suit property and are very much in actual physical possession of the same.

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That by committing such actions, all the Contemnors/Respondents named herein, including the other officers/staff/workforce of MCD have not only taken law into their own hands but also blatantly committed gross, willful disobedience and deliberate contempt of the orders/judgment of this Hon'ble Court. All these Contemnors/Respondents and other concerned officers/staff of MCD have shown scant respect for law, this Hon'ble Court or for its orders/judgment.

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Thus, all these Contemnors/Respondents and other concerned officers/
staff of MCD are, directly and/or vicariously liable for committing willful
disobedience, deliberate and gross contempt of the restraint orders dated
14.1.1999, 22.3.2002 and judgment dated 29.7.2004 passed by this Hon'ble Court
in W.P.(C) No. 244 of 1999 to the express knowledge of MCD. All these
Contemnors/Respondents and other concerned officers/staff of MCD were very
much aware about the restraint orders and judgment (supra). Firstly, MCD was a
party in the W.P.(C) No. 244 of 1999 and participated in the proceedings and
even filed its counter affidavit, as aforesaid. Secondly, even before the
commencement of the demolition action on 16th July, 2007 at the site, the
Contemnor/Respondent No.3 and other concerned officers/staff of MCD present
there were specifically shown the copies of the restraint orders, judgment and
MCD's own counter affidavit. But to no avail.

15. That besides committing contempt, all these Contemnors/Respondents and other concerned officers/staff/workforce of MCD have also committed offence of criminal trespass over the petitioners' suit property besides illegal and forceful demolition of the petitioners' structures on the suit property causing extensive loss

and damage to the petitioner. These offences are punishable under Indian Penal Code and other penal legislations. Despite repeated attempts made by the petitioner through his attorney, yet, the police have flatly refused and neglected to register any complaint/FIR against these Respondents/Contemnors and other concerned officers/staff of MCD in respect of the impugned acts of commission of various offences. Obviously, the police is also acting in a partisan manner. Thus, the petitioner, his family members/other occupants also reserve his right to take suitable stringent actions, including claim for damages for the loss, inconvenience, harassment, torture and agony caused by these Contemnors/ Respondents and other concerned officers/staff of MCD.

- That it may not be out of place to refer here to a news report which appeared in Newspaper dated 20th July, 2007 to the effect that the Lt. Governor, Delhi has issued clear directions to the civic bodies to not to carry out any demolition action in those unauthorized colonies whose site plans have already been sent to the Government for their regularization. Further, it was also directed by the Lt. Governor, Delhi that during Monsoon season, even the Jhuggi-Jhompri Bastis (JJ Colonies) be also not demolished. Heads of various civic bodies were personally present in the said meeting with the Lt. Governor. Copies of the cutting of the Newspapers dated 20.7.2007 are annexed hereto as Annexure: C-14.
- 17. That the present petition is being filed by the petitioner through his duly constituted Special Attorney, namely Shri Lalit Kumar. who is authorized to sign, verify, institute and prosecute the present petition. A copy of the Special Power of Attorney is annexed hereto as **Annexure: C-15**.

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18. That the present petition is being filed bonafide and in the interest of justice.

PRAYER

In view of above and in the interest of justice, it is, therefore, most respectfully prayed that this Hon'ble Court may graciously be pleased to:-

- (i). Take cognizance of the facts disclosed in the present petition and take/ initiate appropriate legal action against all these Contemnors/Respondents and other concerned officers/staff of MCD for having committed gross, willful and deliberate contempt/disobedience of the stay orders dated 14.1.1999 and 22.3.2002 and judgment dated 29.7.2004 passed by this Hon'ble Court in W.P.(C) No. 244 of 1999 titled "Rakesh Kumar & Others V/s, D.D.A. and Others" and commit these Contemnors/Respondents and other concerned officers/staff of MCD to civil prison, as per law.
- of MCD to not to dispossess the petitioner and/or his family members/other occupants from the suit property and not to fence or erect any boundary wall around the suit property and eventually restore the status quo ante.

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Pass such other and further orders in favour of the petitioner which this Hon'ble Court may deem fit and proper in the facts and circumstances of the case.

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

- 7. Clause 4.3 of guidelines stipulates as under:-
 - 4.3 The Resident Society will be required to furnish the following at the time of the submission of the lay out plans:-
 - (f) That, they will abide by the lay out plans to be approved/regularized by the concerned local body as per development control norms, decided for the purpose.
 - (ii) The processing fees and other related charges are to be paid by the society to the concerned local body/DDA.
 - (iii) The Resident Society of the unauthorized colonies would ensure that the provision of the services and land for essential infrastructure and community facilities like roads, parks etc. are made available. In colonies where such land is not made available the colony would have to manage without provisions of such facilities.

2.1 Layout plans, land cost, penalty The base map of the unauthorized (a) colony will be provided by the local body/DDA to the Resident Society who will fix up the boundary on the plan and also get prepared the layout plan of the colony from a registered Architect - Town Planner. This layout plan would clearly show plot sizes, built up/vacant portions and provisions required for infrastructure services/ community facilities. requirement of infrastructure services/community facilities will be assessed in consultation with the local body/DDA. The Resident society would then undertake developmental works of services as per the approved services plan of the colony and on completion of same would apply for regularization to the concerned local body/DDA. Along with the layout plan, the resident society shall be required to submit the following:-Complete list of members with plot Nos. and area in the resident society. Bond indemnifying the body/DDA in respect of all necessary measures for retrofitting against the seismic requirement & for structural stability of the building etc. 6. Clause 4.1 and 4.2 of guidelines stipulates as under:-Registration of Residents' Go-operative Society 4.1 The formation of Resident Co-operative society in each unauthorized colony to liaison with the concerned local body/DDA in various matters would be pre-condition for considering the case for regularization. Regularisation policy of the Government was challenged in this court in a public interest litigation which was finally disposed of by this Court taking on record the guidelines framed by the Government under which it was considering the colonies for regularisation. The said petition was WP(C) 4771/93, Common Cause Vs. Union of India.
- 4. Union of India has since finalised the revised guidelines on the basis of which cases of unauthorized colonies in Delhi would be considered for regularisation.
- Guide-lines framed, to which regularisation has to be effected stipulate as under:-
 - 1.5 In each colony it will be necessary to establish a Registered Residents co-operative Society (henceforth called Resident Society) for coordination, preparation of layout & services plans, execution of development work and for liaison with the concerned local body/DDA in respect of various issues pertaining to the regularization process.
 - 1.6 The Resident society* of the unauthorized colony would take up works for provisions of infrastructure services like road, drains, sewerage, water supply etc. Besides, these infrastructure facilities, the Resident. Society would also make available land to the extent of 15% of the area of the colony for providing other community facilities i.e. parks, community halls, schools etc. This land would be transferred in the name of local body/DDA. In such colonies where land cannot be made available by the Society for community facilities the colony would have to manage without provisions of such facilities.


